Transportation to School

Students at Whitehorse-area schools have two busing options: school bus and public transit.

To find out about bus routes and schedules outside Whitehorse, please contact your school.

If you live more than 3.2 kilometres from a bus route, see below.

School bus

Parents must fill out a registration form for each Whitehorse-area student to ride a school bus. The information helps us plan and provide the most efficient service possible.

The form ensures we have up-to-date contact information and are aware of medical conditions or allergies for your child in case of an emergency. This information will be shared with the school bus company.

Use the Returning Student School Bus Registration Form for one or more students who currently ride the bus and have no changes to their address or school.

Register using the New Student/Change of Address or Change of School Registration Form for each student who has not previously been registered or for whom there is a school change or address change affecting pick-up or drop-off.

The online form is designed for Internet Explorer. If you are having trouble downloading the form, you may not have an updated version of Adobe or you are using a web browser other than Internet Explorer.

There are three ways to submit the form:



In Vancouver

One of Hidden Valley School's Destination Imagination Teams, 'The Northern Fiddle Sticks' was one of two schools in Whitehorse to win at the recent Yukon DI Tournament. They won a trip for 4 days to Vancouver to compete at the Destination Imagination B.C. Tournament. This is 21st Century learning that helps students to work as a team, think-outside-the-box, be creative, and problem solve.

The students performed a team challenge about a wolf (loosely based on the fairy tale, <u>Little Red Riding Hood</u>) who has a phobia about eating meat; he is a vegetarian! For this performance, the team had created a lovely back-drop made out of PCV pipes and painted shower curtains, used props, and wore interesting costumes.

They did a wonderful job at the B.C. Tournament and won the 'Spirit of DI Medal'. The reason why they won this award is because of their HVS Husky team spirit, that exemplifies the true spirit of Destination Imagination! Some of the things that the appraisers looked were that they originally had a cast of seven students, but one boy was away at the time of the tournament. However, the students were adaptable and one student took two roles.
