Welcome back to our returning families and an especially warm welcome to our new families. If you haven't had a chance to drop into the office and to say hi yet, please do come in. I would love to touch base and/or get to know you better. Coffee is always on!

We have a number of extra-curricular activities planned for this year and will be working with the Rec Centre to try and maximize access for students, while avoiding scheduling conflicts with Rec programs. These are some of the clubs and activities planned: science club, crafting, school council, movie nights, canoe trips, lunchtime Gr 6-12 basketball and badminton, recreational Gr 6-12 mixed team volleyball, recycling club, winter outdoors club (ski and snowshoe), and drama. Parents and visitors are reminded that the school is housed in a private, not public building. Schools are classified in this way to better control adult access to children. As children and staff are deserving of a safe environment, we ask all visitors to conduct themselves respectfully and to use polite language in or around the school. Visitors are also asked to refrain from smoking within 5 meters of our school building. Due to several staff and students with allergies and sensitivities to strong smells, we also reserve the right to ask people smelling strongly of tobacco, perfumes, or noxious odors to leave the building. After school homework club is starting up on Monday September 14 and will be run by our EA, Maribel Gabat, who is also a certified teacher. At homework club, students are given the opportunity to work on school work in a supervised setting. Free tutoring for all subject areas up to Grade 8 can also be provided (depending on how many students are present). Children may also gain access to educational websites for online learning. Parents who wish to have their children stay for homework club are invited to have their child drop in.

- 100% of our students have graduated and been accepted to post-secondary programs (most with scholarship money) over the past 5 years
- All of our high school provincial exam results have been far higher than the territorial averages—typically 10-20% higher!

- Don't forget to let us know who is allowed to pick up your child from school and any changes in the normal routine. Your child's safety is our first concern, and we will not release primary aged children to anyone that you haven't cleared.
- Please make sure the school office is notified if your child/children will be away from school. Parents/Guardians need to call to excuse students from school on the day or days he/she will be away due to illness, vacation, etc. Otherwise, students will be marked absent on the attendance register.
