I would like to recognize that our school community has experienced a great deal of stress and concern over the past few months; however, fortunately, the students and staff have been able to work together to make the year feel normal within the school.

Our staff continues to love working at Hidden Valley and working with the children and their families. We continue to use the outdoors as a teaching tool for [place-based learning](#), and we have been incorporating [inquiry-based learning](#) pedagogy throughout our programming.

It is lovely to see happy students carving pumpkins, going to swimming lessons, lacing up their skates, and playing in their mud kitchens. In addition, students are engaged in [Thinking Classroom](#) practices in their math programming, [Heggerty](#) programming and [Daily Five](#) rotations for language arts. These program practices address the individual needs of each student.

We are working with the School Council, the [Yukon First Nations Educational Directorate](#) (YFNED), and parent volunteers to organize a community winter carnival on November 27th. We will also be sending out the [parental volunteer handbook](#) in the upcoming weeks to open our doors to our wonderful community to assist our students. We will be looking for volunteers to assist with various things, including; reading with students, helping with projects, helping with math problems, and many other ways to improve our students' experiences at school.

I want to reiterate that we are here to help in any way that you and your child may need. We have been working with YFNED to supply food hampers to families, working with child counselling services in the school or alternative locations, and supplying a variety of other individualized supports. If you notice any troublesome behaviours, please reach out to us, and we will come together to see how we can help.

## FACE MASKS

## Yukon First Nations Education Directorate

Thank you to our cook Naomi from the YFNED nutrition program, that has been working hard in the kitchen providing meals for students that don't come to school with a lunch or snacks.

YFNED has developed a service for all urban Whitehorse Indigenous youth. Through Jordan's Principle, Winter Break Hampers were distributed in late Winter 2021 to all Indigenous families living in Whitehorse with children aged 0 to 18.

YFNED's Urban Nutrition Program has launched a school-based breakfast and lunch service for all Indigenous students attending Whitehorse schools.

Breakfast, lunch and snacks are available as needed to all of our students. If you have to decide whether your child will eat breakfast or take the bus, then send them on the bus and they can eat breakfast at school. If your child eats their lunch but is still hungry, snacks are available.

## K-12 school guidelines for 2021-22: COVID-19

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- All students (K-12) and staff **must** wear masks in all indoor school settings outside of the classroom.
- This includes hallways and on school buses.
- Exceptions are made when:
  - eating, drinking or participating in physical activities; and
  - when an individual class is, in a supervised and controlled way, transiting from 1 room in the school to another. An example of this is a group of students walking directly from their classroom to the gym.
- Students do not need to wear a mask in a classroom setting, but may choose to wear one if they wish.
- Staff must wear a mask if they are unable to maintain a 2-metre distance from students or other staff.

## COVID-19 symptoms and testing: Can your child go to school or return to regular activities?

This guidance is for children aged 6 months to 5 years old.

This guidance does not apply if your child is severely immunocompromised or has a complex medical history.

Observe and talk to your child every day to see if they have any new or worsening symptoms.

COVID-19 is vaccine preventable disease, but the vaccine is not yet available for younger children. Individuals who are not vaccinated are more likely to become sick if infected with the COVID-19 virus.

The best way to protect children who cannot be immunized yet is to have the adults and caregivers around them fully immunized. Find out about the COVID-19 guidelines for Yukon licenced child care centres, school age programs and family day homes.



### RED symptoms

- Cough
- Fever or chills
- Loss of taste or smell
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing

### YELLOW symptoms

- Headache
- Runny nose or congestion
- Sore throat
- Nausea/vomiting or diarrhea
- Fatigue, or just unwell (acute/intense fatigue, generalized muscle aches not related to physical exertion, significant loss of appetite)

### Your child has NO symptoms

Your child can go to school and return to regular activities.

Continue to encourage them to follow the [Safe 6](#).

If your child has **one or more RED or YELLOW** symptoms, **get your child tested**.

Your child should self-isolate and cannot attend school or take part in regular activities until they've been tested and the result is negative. Phone the [COVID-19 Testing Centre at 867-393-3083](#) or [your local health centre to book a test](#).

**If you do not get your child tested: If their symptoms go away sooner than 10 days without testing, self-isolation is still recommended unless your healthcare provider tells you otherwise.**

**Exceptions:** If your child is throwing up or has diarrhea, keep them at home until 24 hours after their symptoms have gone away. If their runny nose or nasal congestion lasts longer than 24 hours, is mild and not getting worse, and the child is otherwise well, they may return to school. You do not need a written note from your health care provider for your child to return to school and regular activities.

## COVID-19 symptoms and testing: Can your child go to school or return to regular activities?

This guidance is for school-aged children 6 years and older who have not completed a COVID-19 immunization series 14 days before they show any symptoms.

This guidance does not apply if your child is severely immunocompromised or has a complex medical history.

Talk to your child every day to see if they have any new or worsening symptoms.

COVID-19 is a disease that can be prevented through vaccination, but this vaccine is not yet available for younger children. People who are unvaccinated are more likely to become sick from the COVID-19 virus.



### RED symptoms

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- Loss of taste or smell
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### YELLOW symptoms

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- Runny nose or congestion
- Sore throat
- Acute or intense fatigue
- Generalized muscle aches (not related to physical exertion)
- Significant loss of appetite
- Nausea or vomiting

### Notice of Evacuation Sites if School Evacuation is Required for Hidden Valley School

**Jack Hulland School in Porter Creek** is the location for HVS students in case of evacuation.

In the event we are unable to access Jack Hulland School, our alternate gathering place will be Holy Family School in Porter Creek.

Turn on your radio to CBC (94.5) or CKRW (96.1) , or CHON (98.1) all on the FM dial; information and directions will be given over the radio.

DO NOT call the school please; we must have the lines open for emergency calls.

DO NOT immediately drive to the school following an earthquake or other city-wide emergency; streets and access to our school may be cluttered with debris; the school access routes and street entrance areas must remain clear for emergency vehicles.

The school has a detailed emergency response plan that has been developed to ensure the safety of students and staff in the event of emergencies. The plan is reviewed and updated at least annually. The School Council has been provided with a copy of the plan as part of the Annual School Plan.

Dear Parents/Guardians:

Because the Yukon is located in an earthquake-prone area, and other natural or physical plan emergencies can occur which require us to evacuate the school, we want to remind you that, in the case of such an event, the following procedures will be followed.

The school will remain responsible for all students for the hours designated in a normal school day, unless directed to dismiss students by an Emergency Measures authority.

If we are directed to dismiss students, no student will be dismissed from school unless a parent or designated guardian comes for him/her; no student will be allowed to walk or bike home alone.

No child will be allowed to leave with another person, even a relative or babysitter, unless we have written or verbal permission to that effect or that particular person is listed as the students' emergency contact. With this in mind, if your child's information is not up-to-date, please call the office as soon as possible.

All parents or designated guardians, who come to pick up students, must sign the student out with the classroom teacher or the designated marshall at the alternate site Student Release station. This is critical so that we can ensure all students are accounted for and remain safe.

In case we need to evacuate Hidden Valley School in an emergency, our evacuation site is **Jack Hulland Elementary School** in Porter Creek. In the event we are unable to access Jack Hulland School, our alternate gathering place will be Holy Family School, also in Porter Creek.

We are prepared to care for children in the event of a critical situation, or if parents or guardians are not able to reach the school. We have a number of people with first aid certifications, and we will be in communication with local emergency services, as required. We do ask for your help in the following areas:

DO turn on your radio to FM: CBC (94.5) or CKRW (96.1), or CHON (98.1) ; information and directions will be given over the radio.

DO NOT call the school please; we must have the lines open for emergency calls.

DO NOT immediately drive to the school following an earthquake or other city-wide emergency; streets and access to our school may be cluttered with debris; the school access routes and street entrance areas must remain clear for emergency vehicles.

# WE'RE NIT PICKING AGAIN!

Fall and the return to school bring children back into close contact again and with that come the possibility of the spread of head lice. Head lice are tiny insects that live on warm heads. They do not spread disease, however it can be a nuisance and uncomfortable when they decide to take up residence on *your* head!

Head lice can be spread by close head to head contact and sharing items that have been in contact with a head that has head lice. They do not jump or fly.

Head lice should only be treated if you identify live lice on your head. The goal of the treatment is to kill the live lice. Some treatments also work to prevent the hatching of any eggs the lice have laid, also known as nits. However, the most effective way of preventing the hatching of eggs is to physically remove all of the nits. This is time consuming, yes, but really the only effective way of ending the life cycle of the lice. We need to get nit picking!

If you think your child may have head lice, check their head for live lice. Remember they move fast so you'll need to look closely with good lighting. Especially check at the hairline at the neck and behind the ears.

You can help prevent the spread of head lice by teaching your child to avoid head to head contact with other children and not to share combs, brushes, hair ornaments, and hats.

Whitehorse Health Centre nurses recommend that parents check their children's heads weekly to help you identify head lice as soon as possible. If you do identify head lice, please remember that they are just as happy living on a nice clean warm head as on a dirty one. This is no reflection on your family's hygiene. However, if you let the school know that your child has head lice, they will be able to notify the other parents in your child's class so they can be sure to check their child's head more frequently.

They also do **not** recommend that your child be excluded from school because head lice are common and do not spread disease. It is important for your child to be present at school to maximize their learning - especially at the beginning of the school year.


